Day One **HEBREWS 11:1**

People often think of faith in terms of "blind faith"—that we must believe with no evidence whatsoever. But this isn't the case. Instead, we are called to trust in Christ, who demonstrated in very real ways the truth about God. We can look to history, observing that Jesus is the fulfillment of many prophecies, and we can understand that God will fulfill His promises. We can see the power of the Holy Spirit in the lives that have been transformed as a result of trusting in Christ. We can read God's Word and be fully convinced that it is true. Believing based on these things certainly isn't blind faith, but it's also not belief based on empirical evidence. Many people claim, "I have to see it to believe it." If we're looking for this standard, we'll never believe. This isn't the way God works. But if we hear God's promises and long for the blessing guaranteed to those who trust in Christ, our hope will be made reality if we choose to believe wholeheartedly in God's promises.

Day Two **HEBREWS 11:2**



People have often wondered how people in Old Testament times were saved or forgiven of their sins. After all, sin has separated all people from God, and the only way for us to be restored is by the blood of Jesus. Today, we look back to the cross and trust in Jesus' sacrifice as the payment for our sins, and we are saved. For the Old Testament faithful, though Jesus hadn't yet died for the sins of the world, they knew of God's promises to send the Savior. By faith in God's promise to send a Redeemer to pay the price for sin, our ancestors were approved by God.

What is necessary for us to receive God's approval?

How specifically is God calling you to demonstrate your faith in Jesus?

Day Three **HEBREWS 11:3**

Scripture teaches that God is spirit (John 4:24). When we think of a person, we often think first of physical attributes—the fact that a person is a material being—and that we all happen to have a spirit. Yet this is a reversal of the truth. God is a person, not because He has a body (in fact, He doesn't have a body), but because He is a spirit. And the same applies to us, except that we have a body. The world has all sorts of loony perspectives about the origin of the universe, but for those who trust in Christ, we come to believe the Biblical account of creation. Though God is immaterial, He is infinite in wisdom and power and from nothing created all that exists. God has a great purpose for all He's created. One of those purposes is that all creation testifies about the power and glory of God and helps people to believe in Him.

What does it mean that God is spirit?

Day Four HEBREWS 11:39-40

Hebrews 11:4-38 gives a long list of Old Testament believers who lived out their faith in bold ways. Though they never saw the fulfillment of God's promises, their faith was just as real as ours today. But Scripture teaches here that God provided something better for New Testament believers. That "something better" is Christ Himself. Through the law and the prophets, God had revealed all people needed to know in order to live in a relationship with God. However, Jesus, the exact representation of the glory of God, is a clearer, better revelation of the person of God. All believers—those who trust in Christ, Old and New Testaments alike—make up the family of God

Day Five

HEBREWS 12:1-2



All the believers mentioned in Chapter 11 lived by faith, crossed the finish line, and now give testimony to the fact that it was worth all the struggle. The life of faith is much like an endurance race. It can seem long and grueling at times, and we may be tempted to give up. Yet all those who have gone before, through the pages of Scripture, provide the encouragement we need to press on. God provided the strength they needed to endure, and they are now in the presence of God. When we follow their example, and ultimately, the example of Jesus who endured the cross in sight of His future glory, God will provide us with the strength and encouragement we need, and He will reward us with the ultimate prize of eternal life.
